Colombo, June 8

The changes will start with grades 1 and 6 and then be expanded to other grades in stages. One goal is to reduce too much focus on exams and encourage practical real - life learning.

1. Lester James Peries is an internationally acclaimed Sri Lanka film director, screen writer and film producer. He was born on 5th April 1919 in Dehiwala. He had three siblings, two brothers and one sister.
2. He started his **preliminary** studies at St. Mary's Primary College, Dehiwala and later joined St. Peter's Collage, Bambalapitiya. In 1939, he joined the "Times of Ceylon" and in 1947, he travelled to England. There he met another Sri Lankan Mr. Hereward Jansz. Both of them made a short film called "Soliloquy" and it won the Mini Cinema Cup Award in 1949.
3. In 1956, he made his entry into National cinema. His first film was "Rekhawa" and afterwards he produced many award winning films. "Gamperaliya" received the "Golden Peacock" at the International Film Festival in India. "Nidhanaya" was chosen as the best film of the 50 years of Sri Lankan cinema and it was included among the top 100 films of the century. "Wekanda Walawwa" "Golu Hadawatha", "Kaliyugaya", "Awaragira" and "Yuganthaya" are some other films directed by him. His final contribution is "Vaishnavi" (the Goddess) and, "Giraya" was the only tele-drama directed by him. His films often deal with Sri Lankan Family life in rural settings.
4. Lester James Peiris is regarded as the "Father of Sri Lankan Cinema". In appreciation of his service, he was awarded Sri Lanka's highest honorary title. "Sri Lankabhimanaya". A national stamp was issued for him. In addition to that, a hybrid orchid was also named after him. April 5th was named as "National Artist Day" and the "Lester and Sumithra Peries Foundation" was inaugurated on 9th June 2011 at BMICH. It focuses on to provide assistance for the development, promotion and sustenance of the Sri Lankan cinema.
5. Being an active film maker, he had been involved in directing over 28 films including shorts and documentaries. He died on 25th April 2018, at the age of 99 years.
